As she left, Isabella came in. She had just arrived in Canada from Mexico. She had left so abruptly that she had very little when she arrived. She was expecting and was due in a few weeks. As is our custom, we took her upstairs for an intake – the interview we conduct to start a file. We collect some information and share with them the purpose of the ministry and the gospel if we have opportunity. It is one of our best times to begin a relationship with the client family. We don't like to rush it and we like to take time to hear their story. Everyone has a story.


Isabella was alone. She had come to Canada as a refugee. She told us that both she and her new husband had started a small business in their home city. Shortly after the business began, they were approached by someone in the cartel who demanded protection money. If they paid them upon demand, they would "protect" their business. Her husband, a young entrepreneur just starting out, refused. The threats began, but her husband stood firm. When they realized they could not extort any money from him, they stalked him, they beat him and then they killed him. Isabella realized she was not safe and she fled the country, coming to Canada.

She was grieving and traumatized and left everyone and everything in the hope of a future for herself and her child. It was our privilege to stand with Isabella and help her get settled and ready. We had opportunity to pray with her and we had our prayer team pray for her as well. She left with a bassinette filled with some initial supplies that she would need for the baby. God always provides.
